Recognizing cognitive syndromes at early stages requires proper screening tools and clinical acumen for clues to identify the heterogenous presentations of these neurodegenerative disorders. Longitudinal care for these patients requires appropriate medication management, optimizing billing codes, being proactive about planning for changes, and incorporating a multi-disciplinary team approach.
